# **Guidelines for Authors**

**Scope** – 'Voices of Teachers and Teacher Educators' primarily gives space to contributions including empirical researches, studies, policy analysis, personal or institutional experiences, perspectives, book reviews as well as critical commentaries on various aspects in the field of school and teacher education such as teaching-learning, schooling systems, pre-service and in-service teacher education.

The submissions should be original, unpublished work of the author(s) that highlight the contribution of the author(s) in the field of study. It is essential that the empirical studies are situated in robust conceptual frames and offer insights into the issues and analysis of data whether qualitative or quantitative. The manuscript must not be a mere exercise in applying statistical methods to collected data without foregrounding the same in meaningful research questions. Essay type manuscripts that merely list sub-topics or issues in bullet points will not be accepted.

Ideas developed in the text must be clear and coherent; the argumentation must be convincing. The paper must be clear and bring out the points examined in the text so that the reader can have a clear idea of the author's(s') perspective.

Format - The typical length of an article can be from 2500 words but it should not exceed 7000 words including references and appendices. The manuscript must include title, author details, abstract, keywords, well-defined sections and subsections (as applicable for the manuscript type), and proper referencing. (While there is no lower limit, the contribution must not be merely an exposition of a point of view or an uncritical / hypercritical presentation of an experience). The author details must include author name (including professional title), ORCID (if any), designation, affiliation (including department, institute/university/college/school/organisation name, district, town/city, state, pincode, and country), and e-mail address. Names of departments and institutes/universities/colleges/schools/organisations must be included in their expanded forms, followed by their acronyms (if any) in parentheses.

The manuscript should be written in Times New Roman 12 Font or in Unicode (for Hindi) with double spacing. Submit a word file with shortened manuscript title as the filename.

The authors must ensure that all figures and tables are neatly and consistently aligned and that each figure and table is labelled and captioned. For example- "Figure 1: Distribution of students across various disciplines". The description of the figure and the label would be below the figure and for the table above the table.

**Language** - Author(s) need to ensure that the manuscripts are written in clear, coherent, and **grammatically correct** language (English (UK) or Hindi, as applicable). The author(s) must thoroughly proofread their work for language, spelling, punctuation, grammar, and syntax. The language of the text should not be full of jargon or with gymnastics of technical words. It should be purposeful, relevant, and understandable for the audience of the journal.. Nuances such as apt capitalisation for manuscripts in English as well as usage of proper symbols must be duly addressed. Refer to APA 7th-edition guidelines for further details on best practices in academic writing in English (https://apastyle.apa.org/).

Referencing -The author(s) should ensure that each reference is formatted in line with the APA guidelines (APA Style Common Reference Examples Guide, APA Style 7th Edition), and that details such as first-name initials, author surnames, article title, publisher, book title/journal name, volume numbers, page ranges, etc., are complete and correctly formatted.

The authors must include articles and texts that are directly relevant to their study and refrain from using tangential or indirect references. An unnecessary long list of references doesn't add value to the manuscript, rather it is distracting.

**Plagiarism** - As per the policy 'Voices of Teachers and Teachers Educators', contributions with a similarity index higher than 10% on Turnitin would not be considered for review. Author(s) are encouraged to check the similarity index using online mechanisms before submitting the manuscript.

When citing other authors' work or their own work, it needs to be ensured that long quotes or too many quotes are not cited in the manuscript. The contents of the paper should be an interpretation of the cited work, **in the words of the author(s)**. Credit must be given for the work referred to and if it is central to your paper you can make its essence available, but it cannot be through the use of text from the work as it is. The author(s) are also urged to undertake the Plag test for their submission if possible and attach the report so that the process of review is quicker.

(These steps have to be kept in mind, as it is difficult to take up multiple similarity checks for a given manuscript and to have a back-and-forth exchange with the author in that regard).

# Guidelines to send revised manuscript

The revisions in response to comments from the reviewer (including those added by the reviewer in the document) must be highlighted or indicated in a different colour. Alternatively, the author(s) may use the Track Changes or the Google Edit mode or colour code the changes for revision. However, the comments and tracks must not display the name of the author(s) and must not reveal the full identity of the author(s) in any way.

To expedite the re-review process, authors are requested to send an additional file containing a table of responses listing all comments from the reviewer and the corresponding responses of the author(s) to those comments in highlighted form.

The authors must appropriately name the files that they send. For a new submission, a shortened manuscript title may be used as the filename; for revisions, the same title may be suffixed with a "revised", "revised\_2", and so on for subsequent revisions. Any separate files containing responses to reviewer comments may be named as relevant. For example: "Table of Responses\_<Brief Manuscript Title>".

To ensure seamless communication between the authors and the VTTE Team, the author(s) is(are) requested to restrict all future correspondences regarding their manuscript within the original mail thread for the manuscript and not begin/use a different subject line/mail thread for any emails pertaining to the manuscript.
